Box 1

EP 1 - Fore 1933 00

List of historical buildings compiled by Cornelia Berry Fore. The list consists of the names of the buildings and the year of construction. It includes a number of buildings such as the Old Jail, private residences, churches and other sites. Fore was a local historian and active in the United Daughters of the Confederacy. (She signed all of her articles Mrs. J. A. Fore) Additional information regarding historical buildings and Cornelia Fore is available in the Carolina Room vertical files.

EP 2 - Rail 1945 00

An original copy of the *P & N and D & S Magazine* from August 1945. This magazine was geared toward railroad employees of the Piedmont and Northern Railway and The Durham and Southern Railway. It contains photographs and information regarding employees of the railways.

EP3 - Greene 1918 00 (3 Items)

Two Thanksgiving dinner menus from Camp Greene, a World War I training camp located west in Charlotte. One menu was for the Medical Detachment Mess and a separate menu for the Patients Menu.

EP3a - Greene 1918 00

Postcard booklet of Camp Greene, a World War I training camp located west in Charlotte. The cards capture daily life at the camp as well as some of the buildings. They were mailed from former North Carolina Secretary of State, Thad Eure to Charles J. Henderson of Charlotte in 1967. Additional postcards of the same site are located in the Charlotte Postcard Collection.

EP4 - Academy 0000 00

Academy of Music program for *Rip Van Winkle* that was performed between 1902 and 1922. The facility was located at Tryon Street on the first floor of the Trust Building (1902). Program provides names of the Academy's staff as well as the locations of other theaters on the same Leath Circuit. A large number of advertisements identify various stores and businesses in the Charlotte area. For additional information regarding the Academy of Music, see vertical files and *The Hornet's Nest* by Legette Blythe. Photographs of the building can also be found in the Carolina Room's photograph collection.

EP5 - Louise 0000 00

Card from Louise, Inc., a gift store located at 225 North Tryon Street.

EP 6 – Alexander – 1884 – 00

Invitation to Annie Alexander's graduation from the Woman's Medical College of Pennsylvania. Dr. Alexander was the first woman physician in Charlotte, North Carolina.

EP7 – Asheville –1964 – 00

Publication promoting tourism in Asheville, North Carolina. Colorful illustrations.

EP 8 – Gettysburg – 1921 – 00

Published address of Chief Justice Walter Clark before North Carolina Confederate Veteran's Association in Durham, North Carolina 24 August 1921. The title of the booklet is *North Carolina at Gettysburg and Pickett's Charge a Misnomer Also Sixty Years Afterwards and The Rearguard of the Confederacy*.

EP 9 – Crutchfield – 1934 – 00

A letter from Doris Goodwin to Charles Crutchfield, announcer for WBT Radio in which she requests an autograph photograph or poem. For additional information regarding Charles Crutchfield and his role in the development of WBT Radio and Television, please see The Crutchfield Papers. The latter is a collection of papers donated by Crutchfield around 1989.

EP10 – Park – 0000 – 00

Plat map of the property of John G. Park. No date is provided.

EP 11 – Potts - 1839-1860 - 00

Various legal transactions involving debts. Edwin Potts' name appears on some of the documents as a justice of the peace. Other items feature Joseph Potts as one of the litigants. (8 items)

EP 12 – Architects – 1929 – 00

Catalogue of Seven Chevron Concours, An Exhibition of Architecture Painting Decoration Allied Arts. This exhibit presented architectural drawings by some of Charlotte's pre-eminent architects, including Louis Asbury, M.E. Boyer, Jr., E.S. Draper, Charles & Walter Hook, William Peeps and many more. Also featured were works by other North Carolina architects. Art work from students of The Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts, New York School of Fine and Applied Arts were also included in the exhibition that took place January 22-26, 1929 at the Charlotte Chamber of Commerce Building. The catalog identifies the works that appeared in the exhibit. No illustrations are featured in the catalog.

EP13 - WBT 1928 – 00

The official *Radiologue* of Station WBT in Charlotte, Volume 1, Number 1 contains names and photographs of the employees, some of the performers and the station. Also featured are a number of advertisements of Charlotte businesses.

EP 14 – Variety - 1944 – 00

The program from the *Powder & Puff Variety Show*, which was a program sponsored as a War Chest Benefit by Activities Committee at the United States Rubber Company. The show took place at the Charlotte Armory Auditorium from September 30 through October 1, 1944. Contains names of cast members and advertisements of Charlotte businesses supporting the war effort. Two photographs of the cast and one cast member will eventually be part of the Charlotte Photograph Collection.

EP 15 – Ivey – 0000 – 00

Postcard from JB Ivey to DE Henderson during his trip to Argentina. Estimated time of the card is 1938. Ivey died in 1958 and the date on the card is confusing. Also included is a page from a pamphlet of the Ivey's Department Store that includes a lengthy description of the company and employees who worked there. The latter looks as if dates from the late 1920s or early 1930s. Receipt and tag from Ivey and Company 4 April 1958.

EP 16 – Gazette – 1922 – 00

A single issue of the *Queen City Gazette* dated April 10, 1922. The paper was founded in 1888. This particular issue highlights the airing of the first commercially licensed broadcast in the southeast in 1922 at Charlotte's WBT Radio Station.

EP 17 – WLW – 1936 – 00

On November 6, 1936, WLW in Cincinnati aired a program entitled a *Salute to Charlotte* as part of their *Salute to the Cities* series. File includes a letter from the radio station and a copy of the transcript of the show.

EP 18 - Cone Park – 1969 – 00

Brochure of Moses H. Cone Memorial park which is located on the Blue Ridge Parkway. Contains a brief history and photographs.

EP 19 – SteeleCrk – 1960 – 00

The Bicentennial Edition of the Steele Creek News of the Steele Creek Presbyterian Church in Charlotte, North Carolina. Vol. III No 6. It was published in July 1960. Contains a nice history of the church, biographies of past ministers and activities of various committees.

EP 20 – Auxiliary – 1884 – 00

Second Annual Report of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board Missions in North Carolina was published in May 1884. The actual meeting took place on 24 May 1884. Lists the names of local Charlotte women, including Jane Wilkes and clergymen.

EP 21 – Souvenir - c1919 – 00

Small collection of colored postcards featuring prominent buildings and historical sites in Charlotte during the late 1910s or early 1920s. For larger size postcards, see Charlotte Postcard Collection.

EP 22 – Inauguration – 1885 – 00

Ticket to the Grand Inauguration Ball at Irving Hall held on March 4, 1885 to honor President Grover Cleveland and Vice-President Thomas A. Hendricks. Ticket belonged to R. Knapp.

EP 23 – Guilford – 1892 – 00

Invitation to the July 4th celebration of 1892 at the Guilford Battleground in Greensboro, North Carolina. Walter Clark delivered a speech on General William R. Davie; W.A. Guthrie addressed the Confederate Veterans; First Battalion of Naval Artillery provided a military salute, and was led by Major Stuart Cramer.

EP 23a – Valley – 1923 – 00

The North Carolina Society of Pennsylvania published a pamphlet of "North Carolina at Valley Forge." Names of the various committee members of the society are listed in the back.

EP 24 – Oakland – 1924 – 00

Advertisement for auction of homes in Oakland Heights which was one block east of The Plaza. The foldout contains photographs of the homes that sold on May 1, 1924 or 1925.

EP 25 – Bicentennial – 1968 – 00

Program from "The Hornet's Nest," a historical drama that commemorated Charlotte's Bicentennial in 1968. Includes photographs of the author, Legette Blythe as well as the composer, Loonis McGlohon, and members of the company that presented the program. Other photographs include scenes from the production.

EP26 – WWII – 1943 – 01

Two items published by the Chamber of Commerce to assist soldiers who were stationed or passing through Charlotte, North Carolina during World War II.

EP27 – Sanatorium – 1900 – 01

Pamphlet of the Charlotte Sanatorium that was located on 7th Street.

EP 28 - Municipal Convention – 1906 – 01

Program for the Municipal Convention held in Charlotte, NC in 1906.

Publication describing Cinerama, an innovative technique for viewing movies from the early 1960s.

EP 44 – Tables – 1917 – 01

Copy of *New Improved Ready Reckoner*.

Contains tables showing the amount & value of any quantity of merchandise at any price, tables of wages and board, cotton tables, timber tables, grain tables.

EP 45 – Spinner – 1923 – 01

The Spinner's Handy Data Book by P. A. Smith provides information regarding calculations of yarn in the spinning process. Previously owned by J.B. Hulsey.

EP 46 – CCollege – 1957 – 01

Contains fifteen copies of Charlotte College's newspaper, *The Charlotte Collegian* in 1957 with multiple editions for September 18, 1957. The latter describes details regarding the new site for the college now UNC Charlotte.

EP 47 – Ccollege – 1964 – 01

Brochure of the former Charlotte College. One issue from July and two issues - both from October 1964.

EP 48 – Ccollege – 1965 – 01

Brochure/newsletter of the *Charlotte College News* with two issues January and April of 1965.

EP 49 – Blackout – 1942 – 01

Rules and regulations applying to air raids and blackouts in Charlotte during World War II.

EP 50 – Naturalist – 1960 – 01

Brochures published by the US Department of the Interior describing the Naturalist Program in the Great Smoky Mountains National Park. One is from 1959 and five are from June through September of 1960.

EP 51 – Almanac – 1798 – 01

Small, hand-stitched copy of *Beer's Almanac* from 1798 published by Andrew Beers, printed by Hudson & Goodwin of Hartford, Connecticut.

EP 52 – Highlands – 1976 – 01

The second issue of *A Guide to the Southern Highlands* provided travelers with handicraft information in a three-state region.

EP 53 – Mint – 1938 – 01

Brochure describing the exhibition of paintings from the Robert C. Voss [sic] Galleries of Boston, Massachusetts (est. 1841) that was on display at the Mint Museum of Art in Charlotte, North Carolina from February 20 – March 6, 1938.

Brochure describing an exhibition from the Corcoran Gallery of Art to the Mint Museum of Art, March – April 1939.

EP56 – Accounts – 1940 – 01

Letters to L.L. Ledbetter, Charlotte City Treasurer that describe the economic conditions of Charlotte in reports by W. A. Richard of the George G. Scott and Company, CPA's; E.C. Marshall, Vice President of Duke Power Company; C.R. Craven, District Manager of Southern Bell Telephone and Telegraph Company; Oscar H. Phillips, County Farm Agent with the Cooperative Extension Work of the State of North Carolina.

EP 57 – Jackson – nd – 01

Report from an unknown chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution describing their research in determining the exact location of President Andrew Jackson's birthplace.

EP 58 – Rubber – 1945 – 01

Pamphlet contains details regarding the history and activities of the United States Rubber Company's Charlotte Plant.

EP 59 – National – 1944 – 01

Flyer promoting the National War Fund with a description of the 1943 campaign and distribution of funds in 1944. Inside features a map of where the money went overseas and how it was spent.

EP 60 – Speedway – 1925 – 01

Program entitled "The Speedway Record" from May 1925 describes the events surrounding the Memorial Day Race at the Charlotte Speedway on May 11th. Contains biographies of many of the racers, numerous ads of local businesses relating to the racing industry, photographs of the wooden racetracks and details concerning the prize money.

EP 61 – Mint – 1935 – 01

Program for an *Exhibition of Italian Paintings at the Min Museum of Arts*. The exhibition was on loan from Samuel H. Kress of New York and was shown between May 15 to June 2, 1935.

EP 62 – Mint – 1937 – 01

Two programs for the *Inaugural Exhibition of the Mint Museum of Art* that ran from October 1, 1936 to January 1937.

EP 63 – Wac – 02

Checks from Wachovia Bank and Trust Company in checkbook.

EP – 64 – Chmag – 1906 – 02

Single issue of *Charlotte Magazine* August 1906. Published by the Charlotte Magazine Publishing Company.

EP – 65 – Sears – c 1950 – 02

Information regarding payment and charges at the Sears Department Store located at 700 N. Tryon Street in Charlotte. c. 1950s

EP – 66 – CNB – c. 1930 – 02

Banking history of The Charlotte National Bank and a blank check from the 1930s.

EP – 67 – ATC – 02

Bank statement from American Trust Company and two cancelled checks.

Two brochures publicizing *The Old Ladies Home*, which was a retirement center for older women who could not afford to care for themselves and had no family members or close friends. Contains photograph of the building and constitution of this charitable organization. Published in 1914 and 1919.

Six ration books from World War II belonging to the Brockman family.

EP 75 – Alexander – 1911 – 02

Deed between Springs R. Alexander & wife Selma Alexander & R.F. Cochrane on North Davidson Street – November 1, 1911.

EP 92 - Lee Postcard – 1913 – 02

Postcard with a poem in memory of Anne Lee, daughter of Robert E. Lee, who died in 1862 at Warrenton, North Carolina while visiting friends.

EP 93 - Charlotte Symbols – 1960 – 02

Contains detailed information regarding the symbols of the city of Charlotte, North Carolina, including the city's official colors, flower, flag, coat-of-arms, the key, etc. Folder contains miniature version of the key to the city, seals and legal seals.

EP 138 – Roosevelt Letter – 1931 – 04

Letter from Franklin D. Roosevelt, Governor of New York to E. R. Preston, a Charlotte attorney regarding unemployment. Letter was written prior to the presidential election of 1932, when Roosevelt became President of the United States.

EP 139 – Hampton – 1890 – 04

Serial publication by The Forum Extra that is entitled *The Race Problem in the South*. South Carolina Senator Wade Hampton and Alabama Senator John T. Morgan wrote it.

EP 140 – Charlotte – 1954 – 04

Charlotte a Good Place to Live a Good Place to Do Business, a publication of *The Charlotte News*, 1954.

EP 141 – Jaycee Jollies – 1950 – 04

Program of a minstrel review by The Charlotte Junior Chamber of commerce.

Official Mecklenburg County School Board announcements of the Seventh Grade Examination, High School Entrance Certificate and the County Commencement that took place on April 16, 1915.

File contains a letter from Peter Gilchrist of Blacksburg, South Carolina. He was a renowned chemical engineer. He is writing about the Herreshoff Circular Roasting Furnace and adds a blueprint along with the letter.

Provides information regarding scrapping obsolete plane parts, fixed prices for textile industries, machinery, mill and hand tools as well as other machine tools.

Julia Alexander, the only female attorney in the county, was the Toastmistress. Attenders included Alice Paul, Anne Martin and Lucy Burns and representatives from across the United States.

EP 301 Smith – nd – 05

George A. Smith, a Charlotte attorney, sent out this announcement when he moved his practice.

EP 302 Nat. Bank – 1920 – 05

A notice to the shareholders' of the First National Bank of Charlotte of a meeting on 13 January 1920. A proxy is attached to the notice.

EP 303 Traveler's – c 1920 – 05

Letter from the Travelers Aid Society to a possible donor describing the work of the organization in Charlotte. Provides financial data and the number of people who received assistance.

EP 304 Charlotte National Bank – 1906 – 05

Statement of the Charlotte National Bank issued on 18 June 1906. Lists assets, officers, liabilities, and a note to depositors. In addition, the brochure contains the banks' comparative statement for the years 1898, 1902, and 1906. Data in the comparative statement includes in dollar figures the loans and investments; surplus and profits, deposits and total resources. The banks' directors and their occupations are listed on the back.

EP 305 CTUA – nd – 05

Flyer from the Commercial Telegraphers' Union of America who were striking in Charlotte, North Carolina.

EP 306 Political Flyers – 1903 – 05

Statements from a "real democrat" responding to a *Charlotte Observer* article criticizing the local Democratic executive committee to exclude Republicans from a local primary called by the Democrats for its local organization. The second flyer is a response from a member of the committee. Critical of Captain Tom Franklin and the local mayor and is dated 10 March 1903.

EP 307 Hamilton Jones – 1919 – 05

Letter dated 9 December 1919 from Hamilton C. Jones, Chairman of the Mecklenburg County Democratic Executive Committee to Democrats in which he urges them to vote for Clyde R. Hoey for Congress. The letter contains inflammatory remarks regarding blacks and Republicans.

EP 308 Charlotte Hardware – 1923 – 05

Announcement from the FC Abbott & Company to sell \$100,000.00 of 7% cumulative preferred stock of the Charlotte Hardware Company, at par value of \$100.00 per share. Notice was issued on or around 1 May 1923.

EP 309 Piedmont Lyceum – 1919 – 05

Program for a production by the Piedmont Lyceum Association for Tar Heel Teachers, Solon H. Bryan was the Manager. The lyceum movement was popular across America. Some of the people presenting programs included Monteville Flowers, a number of musical groups, magicians and a cartoonist.
