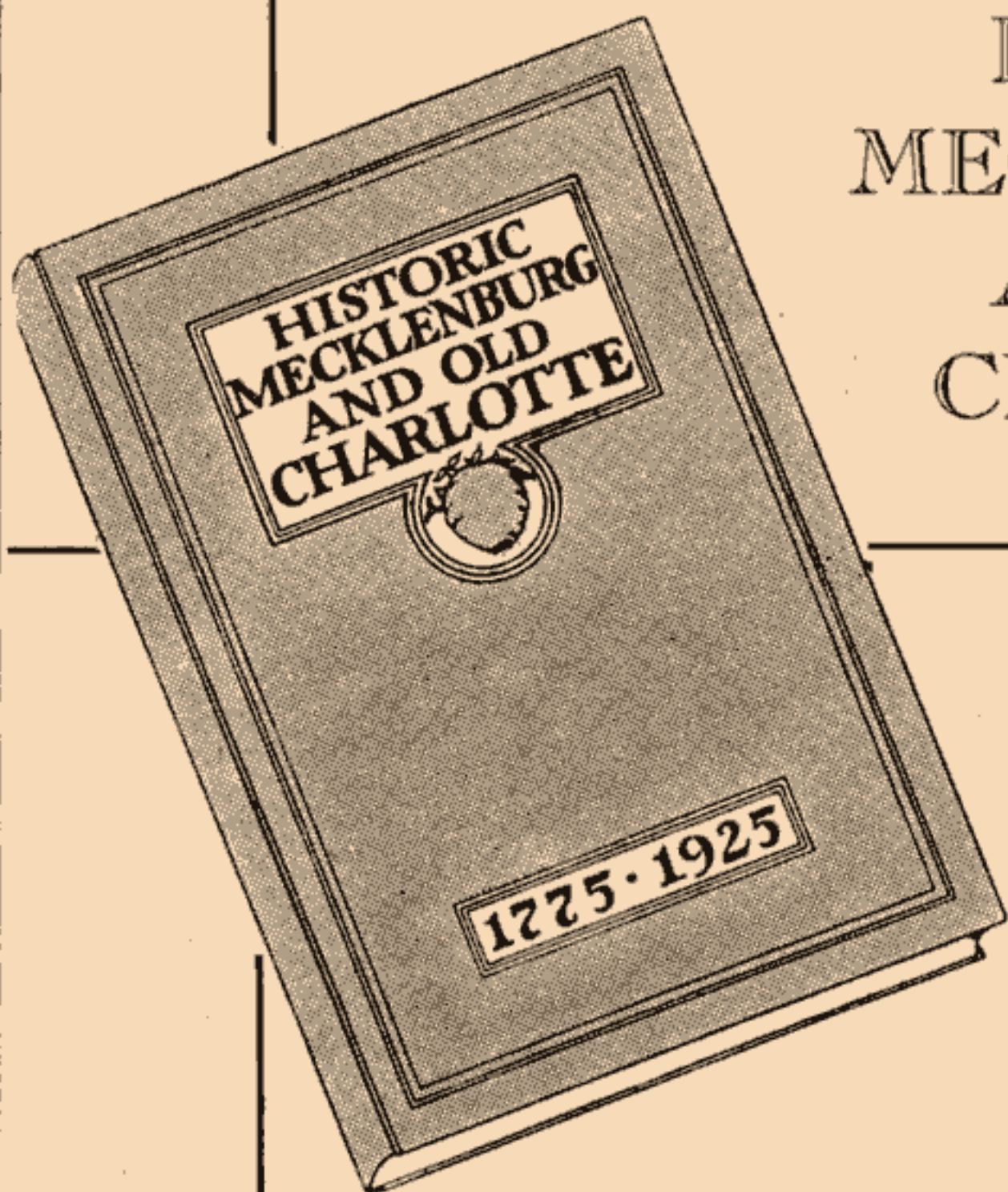

It depicts the coming of the first settlers, who have emigrated here from Scotland after having stopped for a time in Ireland, where they were unable to find civil and religious liberties they were determined to enjoy, and shows the struggles of these pioneers in establishing a civilization in a new land.

**(1762-1768)**

**C**ONTROVERSIES concerning land grants from Lord Selwyn's representatives and tax disputes over the question of the southern boundary of the province arise. The settlers rebel at the attempt to force them to have marriages made legal only when performed according to the rites of the Church of England. A charter is requested of the King for Queens College, and a commission is appointed to seek a charter for a town to be named Charlotte in honor of the Queen.

## EPISODE IV

### The Mecklenburg Declaration of Independence

May 20th, 1775

**T**HE patriots of Mecklenburg, assembled in the little log court house on May 19th, discuss the alarming situation and resolve that independence is the only course open to them. News of the Battle of Lexington and Concord and the appeal to its sister colonies of the Massachusetts Committee of Safety, brought by express messenger, determine them and a committee is appointed to draw up the resolves.

On May 20th Captain Jack, bearing a copy of the famous resolutions declaring Mecklenburg's independence, speeds on horseback to carry the message to the Continental Congress at Philadelphia.

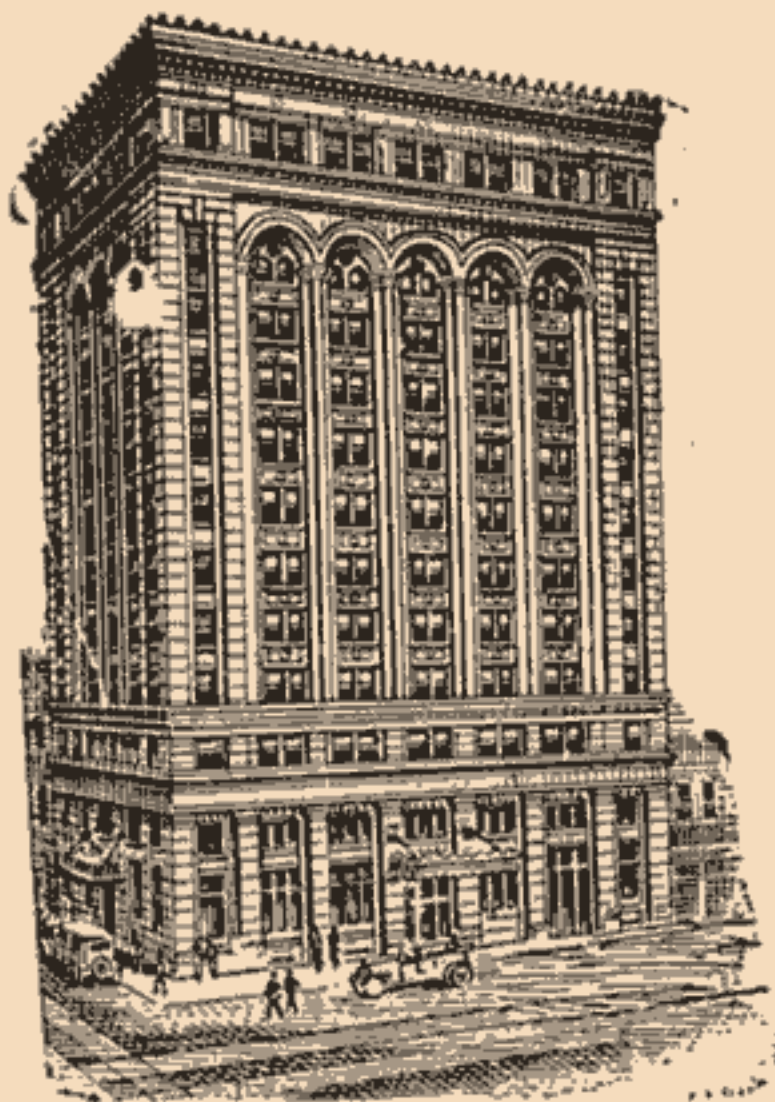




Mecklenburg Court House, Charlotte, N. C., in which the meeting was held May 20, 1775, near the present Independence Trust Co. Building.

# UTILITY SERVICE AND THE COMMUNITY



MORE than any other one factor, the quality of its utility services determines the desirability and attractiveness of a community for business or as a place in which to live.

In industry and in the home the application of electricity to industrial and household operations is multiplying the labor of the worker and relieving the housekeepers of drudgery and fatigue. And while it increases the efficiency of the individual, it raises the quality of the work accomplished as well.
