them to want during their old age in Infirmitie. And
further after paying debts she is to be kept of the remain
der of Horse, Cattle, Sheep and Hogs the Household & Household
furniture Woodlot &c to be divided between her and my
two daughters equally Jean & Elizabeth & to have possession
of my farming household with the Horse and as much
black land and woodlot to support it as my interests
may think fit as, to give to which they are to hold during
a single life of either -

Third I give to my son Charles our aged boy named Job & our Negro
Girl named Mamm on proviso that say son Charles shall
return if he does she is to be returned to be he resides in
County - Then I give to my son George our Negro boy
named Lewis on proviso that if he does she is to be returned to be he resides in
