calling to mind the mortality of my body, Do make this my
will & Testament; And first I recommend my soul to God
God who gave it, & my body to the Earth dust to dust
and as touching such worldly Estate as God hath blessed
I thereby will, give & bequeath in the following manner
viz I hereby request, will, order & direction that my Executors
namely, at a convenient time after my decease do sell
convey all the lands I hold on this side the Mountains
the lands I now have, as may here by Virtue of Letters which
which lie in the State of Tennessee, or on the western side
(Except 1000 acres near Guin William McLean my son) &
sell the same by instalments, as they may see
fit to enhance the price. Also that they sell at public
sale as they may judge proper to discharge the price of
Nagora Slaves also all my other goods & chattels & pay
off after all my debts are paid, the next monies arising
the sale of said lands, Nagora, Goods, Chattels, Monies arising
Bonds, Notes, Accounts, Money on hand &c. shall by my Executors
be paid in the following manner viz. My Wife Ann McLean I hereby
will give & bequeath to my beloved son William McLean
my right & title both in law & equity to 800 acres of land
a part of 1000 Acres Grant on the waters of the river on the
western side, to be laid off in a square form on the
side of said Grant as said William chooses to him & his
heirs. Also I will, give & bequeath to William McLean
William McLean son all the remainder of said Grant but
leave his Heirs & Heirs forever
I will & give to my beloved son William McLean & his
