



(Your G. I. Bill Of Rights)

You may attend a college of your choice with tuition and board paid. Apply for College Benefits at the Veterans' Information Center.

You are entitled to attend any vocational, professional, business or apprenticeship school of your choice with tuition and board paid. Apply for Vocational Benefits at the Veterans' Information Center.

You are entitled to a loan not exceeding \$2000.00 for the purchase of a business. See your Banker.

You are entitled to your old job if you apply for re-employment with your employer within 40 days after receiving an honorable discharge.

Veterans' Employment Advisors are on duty at the U. S. Employment Office to give special attention to your needs. Many business firms are expressly seeking the skills that you have developed in Military Service.

You are entitled to a loan for the purchase of a farm or farm equipment. The amount cannot exceed \$2000.00, See your Banker.

You may secure a loan to buy or build a home (not exceeding \$2000.00). Any Real Estate Agent will help you and advise in making your application.

A disability entitles you to special Vocational Training to enable you to learn a new trade or profession. Apply at the Veterans' Information Center.

Hospital and dependency benefits, insurance conversion, social security benefits and other problems will receive careful attention at the Veterans' Service Division.
