



Power





Charlotte's RADIO STATIONS

In the character and prestige of its newspapers, Charlotte is fortunate. They have played an important part in making Charlotte, the Queen City of the Carolinas.


The Charlotte News (afternoon) and the Charlotte Observer (morning) have the largest circulation in their respective fields of all the newspapers in the Carolinas.

Charlotte is the only point between Richmond and Atlanta which receives the full trunk wire service of the Associated Press.

Charlotte's weekly papers include the Mecklenburg Times, Charlotte Labor Journal and the Charlotte Post.




