ABSTRACT

Nicholas Biddle Gibbon was born on November 28, 1837, one of ten children born to Dr. John Heysham and Catharine Lardner Gibbon. The family resided in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, until 1837, when John became assayer in the U.S. Branch Mint in Charlotte, North Carolina.

Nicholas married Harriet Alexander in Mecklenburg County, North Carolina, in 1870. They settled near Derita, where Nicholas was a farmer, served as a justice of the peace, and was a member of the General Assembly of North Carolina in 1889. Nicholas and Harriet had seven children.

Nicholas died on October 17, 1917, in Mecklenburg County, North Carolina, following a stroke. He is buried at Sugaw Creek Presbyterian Church Cemetery in Charlotte.
