ABSTRACT

The Greater Charlotte Club was formed in January 1906 by Charlotte businessmen who were interested in organizing to improve Charlotte. Their slogan was “Watch Charlotte Grow.” Ran Preston was selected as the club’s first President, and W.T. Corwith, as Secretary. The club proved very successful early on, and was heavily involved in the Meck Dec celebrations. Due to internal disagreements, interest in the organization eventually began to wane, and in late 1912, the decision was made to fold.
