ABSTRACT

William Thomas Harris was born on June 15, 1909, in Cordele, Georgia. He was the second of nine children born to Jarvis Barney Harris (1883-1955) and Mary Estelle Owens Harris (1889-1979). William Harris later married Connie Laverne Childers, with whom he had a son and two daughters.

W.T. Harris, as he came to be known, began his grocery store in Charlotte, North Carolina, in 1949. In 1960, he merged his company with Teeters Food Mart, based in Mooresville, North Carolina, and formed Harris Teeter Supermarkets, Inc. The first store opened in Kannapolis, North Carolina. Harris Teeter Supermarkets continued to be successful, and in January 2014, was acquired by The Kroger Company, although Harris Teeter retained its name, brand, and headquarters in Matthews, North Carolina.

W.T. Harris died in Greensboro, North Carolina, on November 14, 1989, following a collapse while giving a speech. He was living in Charlotte, and was buried in Sharon Memorial Park.
