ABSTRACT

The Light Factory was founded in 1972 by several Charlotte photographers to offer opportunities for photographic education, collaboration, and support. It is located at 1817 Central Avenue, in Charlotte.

The 1998 item is a catalog, published by The Light Factory, in conjunction with the exhibition, *Women of the Photo League*, which was on display from January 24 - March 22, 1998. The Photo League was a volunteer membership organization for a growing community of photographers that existed from 1936-1951. The catalog contains information on the Photo League, as well as photographs.

The 2001 item is an invitation to The Light Factory's Member Show, which ran from May 12 – June 29, 2001. This was a non-juried exhibition providing members with an opportunity to showcase their artwork.
